



Minutes 2/21/11

President Beth Palmer called the meeting to order at 10:05 a.m. She welcomed guests Brian Kross (Ingrid's husband) and Bernadette Marquez' husband, Bob.

Minutes for the January meeting were approved as published in the January newsletter.

Treasurer: Ingrid Kross reports \$4174.27 in the checking account. (Mancuso paid Guild for demonstrating at the Mid-Atlantic Quilt Show.) This is more than the Guild wants to have in the account.

Ingrid renewed "Weavers Craft" for one year and filled in missing issues. (Issue 27 is still the current issue). She bought a 2-year subscription to "Wild Fibers" magazine. She renewed the Guild's membership to HGA, and purchased the DVD and book voted on at the January meeting.

She needs two people to do an internal audit on the checkbook.

A motion was made by Judy Mooers and seconded by Jerry Smith to plan on spending between \$600-&1,000 a year for programs and/or workshops for the Guild. The motion passed unanimously. Because many workshops need to be booked far in advance, it was agreed that the Program Chairman be able to book beyond his/her term.

A motion was made and seconded to form a 3person committee to investigate and plan outreach education, in the form of spinning and weaving classes to the public through the Guild. The motion passed unanimously. Judy Mooers, Jerry Smith, Cathy Sterling, Ingrid Kross and Marsha Rehkamp offered to be on the committee. At the May meeting, a report will be given on the results of the investigation. It was suggested that the committee start by looking at the outreach education grant proposal the Guild submitted to Handwoven magazine a couple of years ago.

Membership: Ingrid asked how to get the information for the New Member packets. The information is, mostly, on Beth's computer. Beth will make up 2011 membership cards. Ingrid will have the 2011 member roster available to distribute at the March meeting.

Librarian: Mary Lou Birns asked that people e-mail her their library book loan requests. She will pick up and drop off of books at the meetings. Bernadette will integrate the list of Dolly's books with the existing Guild library list. Dave Banks is setting up a Book Report Page on the website. Guild members should send their book reports to him.

Newsletter: Barbara Frey requests that people e-mail upcoming events as they hear about them.

Historian: Bernadette Marquez has four books of samples and asked what the Guild wants done with them. Discussion as to how best to make them available ensued. A motion was made and seconded to collect the binders in one place, number each binder, document the contents of each binder into a table of contents, and scan one binder's worth of samples to see how much work is involved in doing it. The motion passed unanimously. Ingrid, Helen, Bernadette and Micki Pugh will work on this. Jerry Smith will store the binders at his house and it is hoped that pdfs of the samples can be put on the Guild's website.

Sandi went through the old binders of program files, taking out and saving anything of interest and discarding the rest.

Ingrid said that she has a complete financial history of the Guild which also needs to be gone through. She will bring it to the next meeting.

Programming: Sandi Petty sent around a book report sign-up sheet for future meetings.

The meeting will be held at the site of the workshop location to be announced.

June - Picnic at Rosalie's. Book reports.

July- View and discuss Madelyn Van der Hoogt's DVD "Warping your loom". Book reports.

September - Doubleweave workshop

December – potluck luncheon and an exchange. Cards, bookmarks, mug rugs or ornaments were exchange suggestions.

Old Business: The Mid-Atlantic Quilt Show will take place the last weekend in February. The Guild will present a "Sheep to Shawl" demonstration. Setup will take place Wednesday; the booth needs to be "baby-sat" on Thursday; the demos will take place Friday & Saturday; and everything needs to be disassembled and removed at the end of the day on Saturday. Ingrid has e-mailed pertinent information to the participants.
