Secretary: Beth Palmer Treasurer: Ingrid Kross The meeting was called to order at 10 am by President Judy Mooers. She welcomed back to our midst guests Penelope Mace and Jeff and Ruth Cleveland. Minutes from our March 17, 2008 meeting were accepted as read. Our current bank balance is \$2,713.05

Judy shared with us two thank-you notes received recently from two of the children who sampled weaving with us at the quilt show in February.

Library report -- Ingrid Kross brought copies of Weaver's Craft. Shawn Clarke mentioned that Sharon Alderman's book on the Structure of Weaving is available and might be useful for anyone considering taking her workshop in September. Judy also mentioned that many of Sharon Alderman's articles can be found in past issues of Handwoven Magazine.

Hospitality -- We voted unanimously to buy a new coffee pot to replace the Guild's pot which has died. Birdie will make the acquisition.

Sunshine -- We learned that Dolly Gaus is dealing with another bout of breast cancer.

Program -- Bob Hecker reviewed plans for upcoming programs. In In June, we will have our picnic at Pam Franck's home in Mathews. In July, Alice Noyes will do a program on tapestry weaving. In August, Pam Franck will do a program on inkle weaving. In September we will host Sharon Alderman for our guild meeting and for a two-and-a-half-day workshop afterward. There will be 16 slots available in the workshop. In October, Sharon Davis will present a program on bound weave. In November, Beth Palmer will present a program on group design for liturgical weaving using doubleweave. In December we will hold our annual luncheon and gift exchange.

Old Business -- Judy passed around a sheet to assess interest in the upcoming Sharon Alderman workshop to be held after our guild meeting September 15-17. She also asked for preferences about where to hold the workshop (Williamsburg or West Point). There will be 16 slots in the workshop. If we cannot fill those slots within the guild we will invite others to join us. Cost of the workshop will likely be \$150. We will NOT use looms for the workshop but rather we will work out weaving drafts on graph paper. Judy suggested that we visit Sharon Alderman's web site at www.sharonalderman.com to learn more about Sharon and her approach to teaching.

We talked about opportunities to demonstrate our craft at various venues this fall. Opportunities we know about at this time include the VA State Fair (starts September 25) and the VA Living Museum (in August).

New Business -- Judy and Jerry encouraged everyone to consider entering fiber items in the VA State Fair. This is a good way to raise visibility for our craft and to win some ribbons!

Pam -- told us about green paraments in summer and winter that she made for St Stephen's Lutheran Church in Williamsburg

Jerry -- V-shaped shawl made on a multi-shaft loom (as a preview of next month's program) and a rug sampler he made at a 3-day workshop on boundweave at The Mannings

Beth -- her first skein of plied yarn, hand towels for church

Alice -- tapestry made with pulled glass weft, handbags

Charlotte -- woven samples made into hot pads, old magazine and spinning book, a face for a doll

Peggy Counce -- knitted hat

Rosalie -- knitted vests

Bernadette -- rag rug plus description of how to add weight to the beater

Sandy -- told us about a Theo Moorman weaving she did to commemorate the 50th anniversary of the Norris Bridge at White Stone; she will try to bring the weaving to our Sept. meeting Ingrid -- towels, dyed merino/silk roving spun into yarn and knitted into a sample Sharon -- a lazy kate she built, woven mandolin strap, knit top, and socks she is knitting from bamboo yarn using the magic loop technique

Judy -- handspun yarn

Penny -- a beaded pin

Ingrid Kross presented a program on weaving on a cardboard box. She distributed 25 pre-cut boxes and weaving needles, got us started, and encouraged us to continue our weaving at home.
