Meeting: Monday, October 16, 2006, 9:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m, in Room C in the James City County Recreation Center, 5301 Longhill Road, Williamsburg. Refreshments to be provided by Rosalie (savory) and Bob (sweet). Please take note of the change in the time. We will start earlier so that the program can begin at around 10:00 a.m. after a brief business meeting.

Program for October: All day workshop with Liz Ackermann. Liz provided the following instructions.

Everyone should bring:

Scissors, ruler, pencil, graph paper in a size that you find comfortable to work with.

Scotch tape. Also, double-sided tape if you already have it. I will bring some so no need to buy any.

Strips of cardboard roughly 6 - 8" long by 1.5" - 2" wide. You will need 12 to 15 of these. Cereal boxes work fine. In a pinch, if you have large index cards they can be folded into thirds to use for yarn wrapping.

Crayons, colored pencils, or magic markers - if you have them. I will bring some, but may not have enough for everyone. You may want to coordinate these with the yarns you'd like to use in your stripe/plaid fabric. We will all be drawing out our plaids on graph paper.

A selection of yarns that you would like to use in a striped or plaid fabric. You can use these to do some of your yarn wrappings, if you like.

Examples of stripes or plaids that you have woven, if you'd like to share them with the group.

*** Option B ****

I recommend the wrappings since it gives you a better idea of how the yarns will look, *but* if you find wrapping the yarn awkward you can choose to do the exercises by drawing out the stripes on paper with crayon, colored pencil or magic marker. If you think you might choose this option for all or some of the exercises please be sure to bring:

Crayon, pencils, or markers in black, and whatever other colors appeal to you or coordinate with yarns you'd like to use in a striped/plaid fabric.

A ruler

Graph paper in a grid size that you find comfortable to work with
