

Minutes 9/20/10

Treasurer: Ingrid Kross reported a balance of \$3,681.50 in the checking account.

Librarian: Mary Lou Birns compiled a list of the nearly 250 books donated to the Guild Library by Dolly Gaus; she handed out copies. She hopes to have the original list and Dolly's additions combined into one list by Christmas. (The original list is available on the website.) She reminded us that books are always available for "check-out" by calling or emailing her.

Newsletter: Barbara Frey is updating the member email list. If you don't receive the newsletter by October 1, email Barbara.

Programing:

September: Members will show the results of the cotton roving challenge at today's meeting. Members also brought in items for sale or exchange; they were set up on the back tables.

October: A field trip to the Workhouse Art Center in Lorton is planned for Wednesday, October 13. Sandi Petty is making the arrangements. The October meeting's program will be a presentation on the field trip.

Are you a color, texture or structure weaver?), we will bring in fibers we love and don't know what to do with and show & tell structure/color projects that didn't work for discussion and inspiration.

December: We will exchange fiber-related Christmas cards. Each participating member will make 20 cards. Some packages of blank cards were given out at the September meeting. Rosalie will purchase more and distribute them to the remaining participants at the October meeting.
